WHAT is the Trasimeno Field School?

1. A six-week summer program of archaeological <u>fieldwork</u>, <u>field-trips</u>, and <u>classes</u>. Students take two courses through the Umbra Institute: ARCH 325 and ARCH 350.

2. A regional archaeological **research** project investigating the settlement history of the Lago Trasimeno area, in the territory of Castiglione del Lago, focusing on the Etruscan and Roman periods (ca. 800 BC–AD 400). Students participate in all aspects: survey, excavation, architectural and artifact studies, and museum exhibition.

3. A community-based **service** project dedicated to local heritage, education, and tourism. In 2025 this includes ongoing work on a new archaeological museum that we are making in Castiglione del Lago.

WHAT do students get?

- 1.5 credits transferred to DePauw (unless there's a conflict with financial aid awards);

- **Practical internship** in archaeology, art-history, history, environmental history, and museum studies from local experts and DePauw professors.
